RULES AND REGULATIONS

1. All exhibits must be grown by the Exhibitor, except in General Horticultural and Floral Art Sections.
2. **ENTRIES CLOSE ON FRIDAY 20th JULY 2018 - ALL SECTIONS. NO LATE ENTRIES WILL BE ACCEPTED.**
3. All exhibits must be staged by **7.30 a.m on 4th AUGUST**. The Flower and Vegetable Marquee will be open for staging **ALL DAY (from 9.30 a.m) AND EVENING ON FRIDAY 3rd AUGUST** and from **6 a.m on SATURDAY 4th AUGUST**. The Marquee will be closed for judging at **7.30 a.m on 4th AUGUST**.
4. The judges will be empowered to reduce or withhold any prizes or to award special prizes at their discretion.
5. All exhibitors whose entries total £4 or more will receive a free ticket to the Showground. Car passes will be available for exhibitors in sections 1, 6 & 7 with entries over £4.
6. A subscription to the Society of £17.50 entitles exhibitors to make entries at half price.
7. The decision of the Judges is final and any person who wishes to lodge an objection against any exhibit must do so in writing and hand it to the Horticultural Section Chairman before 3 p.m on Show Day, together with a deposit of £5. If the objection is upheld by the committee the deposit will be returned, otherwise it will be forfeited to the Society.
8. The words "kind" and "variety" are used in this Schedule in the following sense:-
Roses, Potatoes and Onions are distinct "kinds" of flowers and vegetables. Desiree and King Edward are distinct "varieties" of potatoes.
9. Tabling will be provided if required.
10. All vases, containers, plates and staging must be supplied by the exhibitors.
RESPONSIBILITY FOR THE ABOVE WILL BE WITH THE EXHIBITOR. THE COMMITTEE WILL NOT BE HELD RESPONSIBLE FOR THE SAFETY OF ANY ITEM USED IN THE SHOW.

11. It is the responsibility of the exhibitor to ensure that the correct exhibitor card is placed under their correct exhibit ready for judging.
12. The Floral Art will be judged according to **NAFAS COMPETITIONS MANUAL 2015**. A copy is available from www.nafas.org.uk.
13. **Please Note:** Prize money will be available from the Flower and Vegetable Marquee from 4.00 pm until 5.00 p.m. **Please bring white exhibitor cards with prize labels attached for identification.** Money not collected will be returned to the Society.
14. The time of dismantling will be 5.30 p.m. No exhibit may be removed prior to this time.
15. **ENTRANTS PLEASE NOTE:-** Entrants may reserve any of the items in their exhibit during the day but they may not be removed before the general dismantling time of 5.30 p.m. Failure to comply with this rule will result in the forfeiture of any prize money due or payment of the current trade stand charge will be levied.

Space allowed width 3ft x depth 2ft 3 ins (91.5 x 68.5 cms). Height unlimited. An exhibit that can include some artificial, painted or dyed materials, but this should not predominate.

An exhibit. Space allowed width 3ft x depth 2ft 3ins (91.5 x 68.5 cms)
Height unlimited.
- Class 4. **WOODLAND FORAGE**
An exhibit featuring fruit, vegetables and foliage. Space allowed width 3ft x depth 2ft 3ins (91.5 x 68.5 cms). Height unlimited.
- Class 5. **MINIATURE GARDEN**
A petite exhibit. Space allowed w10ins x d10ins x h14.5ins (w25 cms x d25 cms x h 37cms)
- Class 6. **RAINBOWS END. An exhibit of seven flowers and foliage.**
Space allowed width 2ft x depth 2ft 3ins (61 x 68.5 cms). Height unlimited

A list of the species used must be provided and will be judged as an integral part of the exhibit and their relevance to beekeeping. (Related accessories allowed.)
- Class 60. Junior class up to the age of 16 years. An arrangement of common, NOT RARE, flowers (and their foliage and fruit) from which the honeybee gathers nectar and pollen, arranged in a TWO LITRE ice cream carton. The exhibit will be judged on its artistic merit and relevance to beekeeping, NOT on the number of species present.
