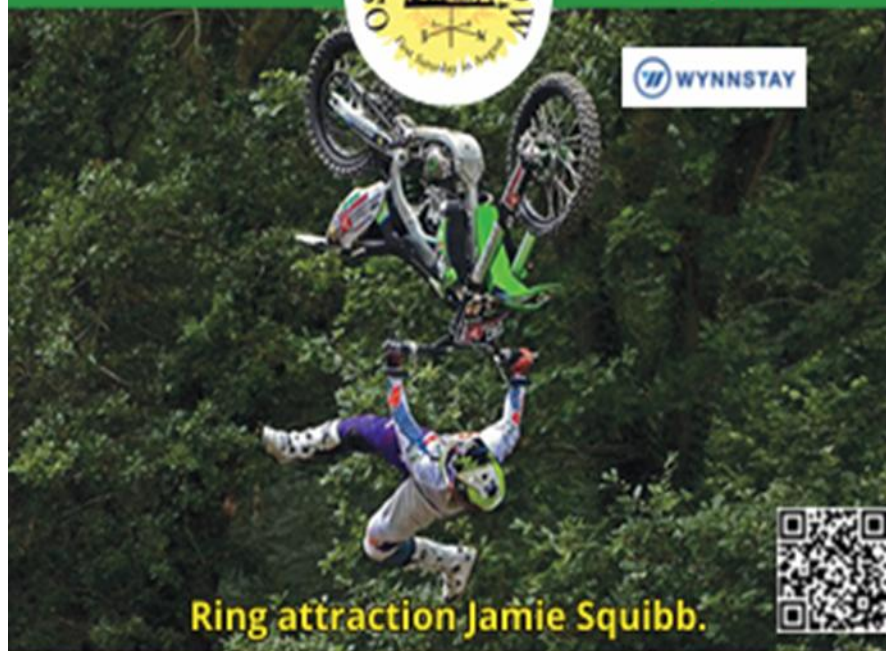

## **Rules and regulations relating to Livestock Sections**

### **Challenge Cups & Trophies**

1. All trophies and Special Prizes shall be competed for only by Exhibitors who are members of the Oswestry and District Agricultural Society.
2. Each challenge Cup or Trophy to be held for one year, and to be returned when requested and in the event of loss the amount of its value to be made good by the holder to the Society.
3. Cups will be available for collection from the Secretary's Office on Show Day after the Grand Parade (approx. 3.45) until 5.30 pm. Exhibitors unable to collect cups on Show Day can pick up their trophies from Oswestry Show Office by arrangement before the end of September.

### **Conditions under which entries are accepted.**

4. All the exhibits must have been bona-fide the property of the Exhibitor for two calendar months before date of entry.
5. There must be a minimum of three exhibitors in each class otherwise the class will be cancelled.
6. All exhibits must be described in the catalogue. Substitutions are only allowed in the Cattle Section.7. The Committee reserve the right to themselves the power to sanction a judge to withhold any of the prizes offered if in his opinion the exhibits do not possess sufficient merit.
8. A 2nd prize will only be awarded if there are 3 or more entries. A 3rd prize will only be awarded if there are 4 or more entries.
9. All horses and ponies must work in the area provided.
10. Exhibitors in classes for Horses and Livestock must be on the Showground not later than 9.00 am on Show Day. Livestock must not be removed from stock lines, pens, or stages until AFTER the Grand Parade of Livestock, not earlier than 4.00 - 4.30 pm. Please note, Horse rings 2,3,4, and main ring start at 8.30am.

**EXIT ONLY TIMES FOR HORSES 2026 - All Exhibitors to be on showground by 9.00 am. There will be hourly exit times from 10 am - 1.00 pm of 10-minute periods on the hour then all EXITS will be after the Grand Parade for Horse Lorries and Horse Trailers.**

11. All stock should be ready for judging 30 minutes before the class.
12. Each exhibit must be in the charge of an attendant, who is required to conform to Rules and Regulations of the Committee and be subject to the orders of Show Stewards. This rule will be strictly enforced, and there will be a fine of £5 if an attendant is absent from the animals.
13. The Society's Veterinary Surgeons may on their own authority give to any animal such emergency treatment, as they may consider appropriate if the owner or his representative cannot be immediately found. Exhibitors to be required to meet full cost of this treatment and any other costs involved in connection with any veterinary treatment given on the Showground.
14. Any person who wishes to lodge an objection against any Exhibitor must do so in writing and hand it in to the Secretary's Office on the Showground before 4.00 pm on Show Day, or within half an hour of judging of the Class involved. A deposit of £10 must be paid which will be returned if the objection is upheld by three members of the Livestock Committee, otherwise it is forfeited to the Society.
15. NO SMOKING will be allowed in or around the livestock lines or horseboxes.
16. The Showground will be open on the afternoon prior to Show Day.
17. Exhibitors should check on the position of equipment provided for firefighting. In the event of a fire notify the steward. If it is safe to do so, tackle the fire with extinguishers until the Fire Services arrive.
18. Judges & stewards have the delegated power of the Society to enforce the Rules & Regulations relating to livestock entries. **THE SOCIETY WILL NOT ACCEPT ABUSIVE BEHAVIOUR TOWARDS JUDGES & STEWARDS.**
19. The Chief Steward of each livestock section have the discretionary powers to excuse the parading of an animal where it is unruly and likely to upset or cause damage to other animals; attendants or the public.
20. Prize Money for Horse and Livestock Exhibitors, payment will be made by cheque or BACS payment no later than the end of August.
21. Prize entries in the Horse and Cattle Classes must take part in the Grand Parade. Exhibits to wear numbers and prize rosettes.

**IMPORTANT: ALL CHAMPIONS, RESERVE CHAMPIONS AND/OR 1<sup>ST</sup> PLACED PRIZE WINNERS ARE REQUIRED TO JOIN THE GRAND PARADE. FAILURE TO COMPLY WITH THIS RULE WILL RESULT IN PRIZE MONEY BEING FORFEITED. ALL 2<sup>ND</sup> AND 3<sup>RD</sup> PLACED PRIZE WINNERS ARE INVITED AND ENCOURAGED TO JOIN THE GRAND PARADE A GRAND PARADE RAFFLE – 2 x £50 PRIZES KINDLY SPONSORED BY BOWEN ESTATE AGENTS FOR THE HORSE SECTION AND – 2 x £50 PRIZES KINDLY SPONSORED BY OSWESTRY LIVESTOCK AUCTION FOR THE CATTLE SECTION TO BE PRESENTED IN THE MAIN RING**

24. Exhibitors are requested to fix rosettes on prize-winning animals or their stalls after judging.

25. All horses and ponies in height restricted classes must on instruction of the judge or any official of the Society produce a certificate of height or be measured by the Society's Veterinary Surgeon.

26. Exhibitors should ensure they are acquainted with regulations at start of Cattle and Sheep sections.

27. **There is to be no movement off the Showground of any livestock vehicles during the Grand Parade.**

#### DISCLAIMER OF LIABILITY

28. In this clause the term Exhibitor shall include persons taking part in any competition or display arranged by the Show Committee, and the owner of any animal, plant, machinery, or other thing involved in any such competition or display or otherwise exhibited on the Showground. Save for death or personal injury caused by negligence of the Committee, its servants or agents the Committee will not be responsible for death, injury, disease, damage, or loss caused to any exhibitor or to any animal, article, plant, machinery, or thing of whatever nature brought onto the Showground by the said exhibitor from whatever cause death, injury, disease, damage, or loss arises.

(Save as aforesaid) the Exhibitor shall indemnify the Committee against all claims, damages, and expenses whatsoever in any way arising out of the presence of the exhibitor, his servants, agents, exhibits, vehicles, or equipment on the show ground and shall assume full responsibility, therefore.

Acceptance of the foregoing provisions shall be a condition of entry. Exhibitors are advised to insure against fire and other appropriate risk not only as regards their own but also against third party claim, 29. Exhibitors are alone responsible for the accuracy and eligibility of their entries.

30. The Society has taken all reasonable measures to ensure the health and safety of everyone present. For these measures to be effective, everyone must take all reasonable precautions to avoid and prevent accidents occurring and must obey the instructions of the organisers and all officials and stewards. The Society, its officers and servants or agents shall not be responsible for any injury, damage or loss however caused to any animal, article or other property belonging to the exhibitor and the exhibitor agrees to indemnify the Society in respect of any costs in connection with any claims made upon the Society because of the action or omission of the exhibitor or any employee of the exhibitor.

Each exhibitor shall be solely responsible for any loss, injury or damage that may be done to, or occasioned by or arising from any animal, article or property exhibited or brought on to the Showground by him and he shall indemnify and hold harmless the Society from and against all actions, suits, expenses and claims on account of or in respect of any such damage or injury which may be so caused or occasioned

The Society, its officers or servants will not be liable for any errors or mistakes that may happen in placing or penning the stock or articles to be exhibited but the servants in charge of the same must see that they are placed according to their entries.

# HORSE

Please note: -

**EXIT ONLY TIMES FOR 2026 - All Exhibitors to be on showground by 9 am. There will be hourly exit times from 10 am - 1.00 pm of 10-minute periods on the hour then all EXITS will be after the Grand Parade for all Horse Lorries and Horse Trailers.**

Recommendation from Association of Show and Agricultural Organisation Suitable mounted - All animals ridden anywhere on the showground, rings or lorry parks (day or night), must be ridden by a rider whose size and weight does not compromise the animal's welfare. We are operating under the 20% weight guideline where the rider in full riding attire with full tack must be less than 20% of the animal's bodyweight. This is based on a relatively fit, healthy animal, as an overweight animal is also a welfare concern.

In the event of a fall of horse and/or rider the competitor should leave the ring immediately on foot.

The Judge need not ride all horses forward. Riding hats must comply with the current safety standard (refer to your Society/Association rule book) and be worn by riders at all times when mounted.

Grand Parade Raffle - Two prizes of £50 kindly sponsored by Bowen Estate Agents. All prize winners appearing in the Grand Parade are eligible.

Cups can only be collected from the secretary's office after the Grand Parade has finished. Exhibitors unable to collect cups after the Grand Parade can collect from the show office by prior arrangement after show day. No cups will be given out prior to the Grand Parade. Payment of Prize Money – Horse Class Prizes will be sent by cheque within two weeks of the show.

Equine Influenza - All horses present at the show are required to be fully up to date with their Equine Influenza vaccinations. All horses starting a new course of vaccination after the 1st January 2026 must comply with the requirements of the primary course. (1st vaccination and then 2nd vaccination between 21 – 60 days later), followed by the first booster (120 – 180 days) and all subsequent boosters. Horses may compete having received the primary course and prior to the first booster but not within 7 days of receiving a vaccine dose. Horses must have been vaccinated within 12 months before the show but not less than 7 days of arriving at the show.

Foals - In-foal mares that have already had vaccinations of primary Equine Influenza course should be vaccinated 4-6 weeks before the foal is due to be born. Foals should be vaccinated for Equine Influenza at 6 months to commence their primary course. Please consult your own veterinary practice for further information. Passports will be checked at random during show day.

This Show is a qualifier for the NCPA Pony of the Year Show in September 2026. 1st and 2nd Prize winners qualify. NCPA affiliation number 122/26 (except Novelty Classes).

## Class 9

### TATTERSALLS RoR AMATEUR RIDDEN SHOW SERIES QUALIFER 2027

Open to all RoR and NR competition registered horses, 4 years and over, mares and geldings, owned, produced, and ridden by an Amateur. Riders must be 15 years or over on the 1st January 2026. Horses should be ridden in a snaffle, pelham or simple double bridle with a plain cavesson noseband. Horses should be plaited. Racing injuries and blemishes ARE IGNORED in this series.

The Series is open to **AMATEUR** riders only - those employed in racing will be allowed to compete. Class will be judged under 'riding horse' format without 'type' being taken into consideration. The Judge will not ride in the qualifiers but will ride in the Final. Competitors/handlers/grooms must wear a safety/kite mark hard hat with chinstrap. **The first three go forward to the final at the Hickstead Derby Meeting June 2027.** The winner also qualifies for the Tattersalls RoR Amateur Ridden Show Series Special at the Jockey Club RoR National Championships in August, 2027. Highest placed Veteran qualifies for the RoR Ridden Veteran Final on the same day, August 2027.

Amateur definition: The rules as in the rulebook with the following addition that an amateur may not show a horse owned or sponsored by a company or commercial firm. In addition, a person classed as an amateur must not be supported by a company in anyway or act as brand ambassador whether financially or in kind. An amateur is a person who for the purpose of RoR classes does not/has not during the current season or previous season: Engage (d) in breeding, livery, buying or selling, dealing, or hiring horses in a commercial capacity. Horses must not have been stabled at or reside in a Professional Producer's/Trainer's yard from January 1st, 2025. Riders must not have ridden any animals produced by a Professional/Trainer in the current or previous season. Horses and riders must not receive any help from a Professional Producer/Trainer at a SHOW in the current season. A rider who has ridden for a Professional/Producer Trainer in the current or previous season must not have ridden horses at a show. Any breaches of this ruling will be taken seriously and will result in disqualification from future classes.

## **Class 10**

### **TATTERSALLS RoR OPEN IN-HAND SHOW SERIES QUALIFER 2026**

Open to all RoR and NR competition registered horses, 3 years and over, fillies, mares, and geldings. Handlers must be 15 years or over on the 1st January 2026. Horses do not need to be shod to compete in the RoR Open In-Hand class. Horses can be shown in a bitless/In-Hand Bridle. Blemishes caused through racing will be ignored. All those entering horses and/or participating in the show agree to be bound by the Retraining of Racehorses Rules and Regulations from time to time in force.

Handlers/grooms must wear a safety/kite mark hat with a chinstrap. **The first three go forward to the final at The Jockey Club RoR National Championships at Aintree August 2027.**

Competitors and Horses must hold a minimum of LIHS Qualifier-Eligible Membership/Horse Registration with the Association to be eligible to compete in the LIHS BSHA Showing series. Any competitor that qualifies for a LIHS Showing Series Supreme Final, must then complete full LIHS Qualified Registration within 14 days for their qualification to stand, or it will pass to the next eligible exhibit (the nominal cost of Qualifier-Eligible membership will be taken off the cost of Full LIHS registration). Any competitors/horses which have existing BSHA membership/registration for 2026 will not be required to complete any LIHS Membership/Registration for these classes.

## LIHS RISING STAR CLASSES 2026

Please note Rising Star Amateur Rules 2026 are separate from BSHA Amateur Rules in the main BSHA Rulebook. If you are in any doubt regarding your Rising Star Amateur status, please contact the BSHA Office directly, to have your status confirmed.

Classes 13 & 14 qualify for LIHS BSHA Rising Star Supreme Finals at the London International Horse Show, highest placed unqualified in top five to qualify.

A results points table will run for all qualifying classes, and a 'wild card' will be awarded to those unqualified with the highest points in each section following the final qualifier.

The Judge will NOT ride exhibits in these classes or at the Finals.

### **Class 13 RISING STAR SMALL/LIGHTWEIGHT HUNTER TYPE**

Mare or gelding, 4 years old and over (lightweight exceeding 158 cms, small hunter exceeding 148 cms, but not exceeding 158 cms). Capable of carrying up to 79.5kgs (12st 7lbs). Rider to be 15 years or over. The highest

placed unqualified horse in the top 5 will qualify for the LIHS BSHA Rising Star Small/Lightweight Hunter Supreme Final at the LIHS in December.
